ב לקבע מזוזה Blessing For A Mezuzah

In the Torah, it is written: "And you shall write them [these words] on the doorposts of your house..." (Deuteronomy 6:9)

From there, Judaism instituted the practice of placing a small container on the doorpost of the house with the words of Deuteronomy 6: 4-9 inscribed on small parchment scrolls.

Since the act of placing a mezuzah is considered a *mitzvah* (commandment), a speciall blessing is said as the container is affixing to the doorpost.

The mezuzah is placed on the doorpost about one third of the way down at a 45 degree angle facing in toward the house.
