## S'lichot

**Saturday, September 12th at 7:30 p.m.**

S'lichot is the observance that starts the High Holy Days season. Join with the Temple Chaverim clergy, Rabbi Jeff and Cantor Alison for a **virtual gathering** as we reflect, pray and engage in discussion on the meaning of the High Holy Days.

## Rosh Hashanah Evening

**Friday, September 18th at 8:00 p.m.**

Join us **via YouTube** as we welcome the High Holy Days together live-streamed from the temple sanctuary. Start 5781 the right way with a prayerful presentation, filled with familiar High Holy Day liturgy and meaningful readings.

## Rosh Hashanah Day

**Saturday, September 19th**

➤ **10:30 a.m. Virtual Morning Prayer Service**

Join us **via YouTube LIVE** as we celebrate and ring in the new year. Rabbi, Cantor and recordings of members of our wonderful adult choir will lead us in prayer and song to welcome the new year.

➤ **1:00 p.m. Torah - Looking at the Binding of Isaac**

Hear the Torah portion chanted and the dramatic reading in English of the High Holy Day portion. Then, join in a conversation about the powerful and problematic nature of the story called the Binding of Isaac.

➤ **2:30 p.m. Songs of Hope**

Enjoy an hour of meditative and up-lifting music pre-recorded by our clergy, congregants and cultural icons. In the difficult times, hear and sing along to a much-needed message of hope.

➤ **4:30 p.m. Traveling Shofar**

Come hear the sound of the *shofar* in-person. Visit one of three live locations (**in Huntington Station at Stimson Middle School: in Centerport at the Congregational Church: in Northport at Richter's Orchard;**) and hear from the safety of your car (or just outside it) the call to the holiness of this season.

➤ **6:30 p.m. Drive-Through Tashlich**

Join us **in the temple parking lot** for a change to "cast away" your sins AND help feed the needy in the greater Huntington area. Drive through a spiritual path of meditation and reflection on your way to be greeted by Rabbi Jeff and Cantor Alison as you deposit your loaf of bread in a bin.

## Kol Nidre

**Sunday, September 27th at 8:00 p.m.**

It's the holiest day of the year, so we begin our time of reflection with **live-streamed** prayer from the sanctuary. *Kol Nidre*, the haunting melody of the High Holy Days, will play three times, calling us to repentance.

## Yom Kippur

**Monday, September 28th**

➤ **10:30 a.m. Yom Kippur Morning Service**

The Days of Atonement continue with powerful worship and song, again **live-streamed** from the sanctuary. Be with Rabbi, Cantor and recorded members of our wonderful Adult Choir virtually as we seek forgiveness for the shortcomings and errors of the past year.

➤ **1:00 p.m. Yizkor**

A quiet, peaceful service to remember and honor our loved ones. **Live streamed** from our sanctuary with Rabbi and Cantor, prayers and mournful melodies will provide the opportunity to honor the memories of loved ones we carry in our hearts.

➤ **3:00 p.m. Healing Service**

It has been a difficult year in many ways. As we look to wipe our personal slates clean, we take a little time to make ourselves whole again. Be a part of this healing service, with readings, songs and meditation to encourage you and help lift your spirit.

➤ **4:00 p.m. Virtual Prayer Service for Religious School Families**

Spend some time with Rabbi and Cantor **on Zoom**, thinking about the good and not-so-good moments this past year. Together, we'll ask for forgiveness, sing a little and share a story of one man who tried to run away from his responsibility, but didn't get too far.

➤ **5:30 p.m. Neilah and Havdalah**

The sun is starting to set and *Yom Kippur* is coming to an end. Be there for a message of hope and blessing in the new year. *Neilah* (the concluding service) and *Havdalah* (the very brief ritual of separation) **live-streamed** from the sanctuary will help us bring these Ten Days of Awe to a conclusion.

# Days of Awe

The temple's Sanctuary is open during the Days of Awe (the time between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur). Spend time in thought, meditation or prayer seated in our most sacred space. Familiar High Holy Day music and recorded readings will provide a spiritual atmosphere as you reflect on this past year and work towards making amends at this important season.
