# Healing in a Place of Hope

It was not the summer I had anticipated. The call from my dad on that July morning certainly changed what I was doing. Instead of preparing for two weeks in the Berkshires, Carol, my kids and I were packing for a funeral and several days in my hometown.

Aside from the Alzheimer's that struck 8 or so years ago, my mother had remained mostly healthy. Yet, within a short span of a few hours, her body shut down. If it had to be an Alzheimer's story, hers was among the best possible. For all those years, my father devotedly had taken care of her at home. Even with aides spelling him a few hours on certain days, he managed a routine that kept her comfortable and in familiar surroundings. It was truly a labor of love, one my father managed with remarkable dedication.

The funeral service was beautiful and a lovely tribute. My sister and I wrote a meaningful tribute; my niece and nephew, both very musically talented, sang a piece dedicated to their grandmother; and rabbinic and cantorial colleagues spoke eloquently and with tremendous heart. The burial, in close to 100° weather, and sitting *shiva* at my childhood home brought some sense of closure as well.

As the week of mourning neared its end, I knew I soon would be heading to a familiar place - camp. But I had no idea how much it would end up being such a place of healing.

Many people know that I LOVE camp! For several summers (pre-COVID), I would spend three weeks serving on faculty at Crane Lake Camp (CLC) in West Stockbridge, MA. My time there always is so energizing and fulfilling. As a Jewish overnight camp affiliated with our Reform movement, CLC tries to promote Jewish pride and values in campers. Made up of rabbi, cantors and educations from all over the New England, New York and New Jersey, camp faculty works to provide fun programming that demonstrates and exemplifies the best of Judaism.

With COVID, it has been three summers since I was last on faculty. Yet, walking into camp was like being at home. Some of the faces had changed and even a few of the facilities. However, the welcome I received ("RABS!!!") and the warm embrace of the camp community lifted my soul. In the two weeks I was there, I watched the faces of campers who sang and danced with gusto traditional Jewish prayers (sung to cool, uplifting melodies); I talked with colleagues, counselors and camp leaders who treasured the work they were doing to mold kind and thoughtful Jewish souls; and I saw all around me campers of all different backgrounds, colors, ethnicities, gender identities, all of whom felt so positive about being Jewish - this more than anything gave me strength and hope.

My mom believed in Jewish camping. She sent me starting at the age of 9 and never once questioned each summer I returned, especially as a counselor (despite better paying summer employment or internship opportunities available). Judaism and the Jewish community were important to her, values she impressed upon me. As I stood in the beautiful outdoor chapel one Shabbat at camp, saying the *Mourner's Kaddish*, I felt she was with me. And I knew I was okay.



- LGBTQ+ individuals, families, couples looking for an accepting and vibrant Jewish community






