Project Understanding has provided a vehicle for Catholic and Jewish high school students to gain a greater knowledge of their own and each other's religion through experiences on Long Island and in Israel.

8 Ways to Celebrate Shabbat This Summer

A time for family and fun; a time to seek that separation from the rest of the week; that holiness that comes with seeking the connections between yourself, God, and others. Shabbat is here year-round but summer is a special season with sun and fun and school out of session. Here are a few ways to celebrate Shabbat during the lazy days of summer.

- **1.** Bake a *challah*. I know, I know. It's hot outside. But usually during the summer months, schedules tend to slow down. The days are longer and there is time to bake some delicious *challah*. My favorite sweet *challah* recipe by Super Rebbitzin can be found at www.allrecipes.com. It is so good and makes a lot!
- 2. Listen to some Jewish music or a Jewish Podcast. There is a wealth of Jewish music and podcasts to listen to, whether you choose your favorite streaming platform or a CD, listen to the Jewish Rock Radio station online (www.jewishrockradio.com) or choose a podcast. Some of my favorites are Tablet Parsha in Progress, URJ Ten Minutes of *Torah*, or the irreverent OMFG podcast of Rabbis Jen Gubitz and Jodie Gordon. Find an inviting chair in your backyard or take a walk and relax.
- **3. Read a Jewish book.** There is a wealth of good Jewish books out there, whether you read a book with Jewish themes or support a Jewish author. Some of my favorite Jewish authors are Jennifer Weiner, Dara Horn, Anita Diamant, and Alice Hoffman.
- **4. Come to Temple Beth El for a Summer** *Shabbat* **service.** Of course, I have to include that you can come to the temple for *Shabbat* services! In the summer, our services are intimate, informal and lay-led. They are often held in the Great Room and you can stay for a chat and a nosh afterwards.

5. Take a nap. God created the world in six days and then rested. We should do the same! Find some comfy place to rest and refresh yourself with some well-deserved sleep.

- 6. Turn off your devices. Remember a time when we didn't have smartphones and we unplugged the landline during dinner? Take the plunge and turn off all your devices for 24 hours. See how different your day goes and how much more present you are with other people.



Social Action News...


The Social Action Committee wants to thank all of our very generous donors that allowed us to have the largest Mother's Day collection ever!




