Finding the Win in Every Swing

I came across a story recently that made me smile.

A young boy decided to play some baseball in his backyard. Though none of his friends were around, he was determined to get in a “few innings.” With bat and ball in hand, he loudly announced, “I’m the greatest hitter in the world!”

He tossed the ball into the air, swung hard - and missed. “Strike one!” he yelled.

He picked up the ball and said again, “I’m the greatest hitter in the world!” Feeling confident this time, he lobbed the ball, swung...and missed again. “Strike two!”

The boy examined his bat and ball. He spat on his hands, rubbed them together, tugged his cap, and repeated, “I’m the greatest hitter in the world!” One more toss, one more mighty swing...and one more miss. “Strike three!”

“Wow!” the boy exclaimed. “I’m the greatest pitcher in the world!”

As I write this article, the Toronto Blue Jays and Los Angeles Dodgers are locked in a close playoff battle. (I can already hear the sighs from fans of the Yankees and Mets!) So, perhaps it’s no surprise that a baseball story caught my attention.

There have always been fascinating connections between baseball and the Jewish people. Along with well-known players - like Sandy Koufax, who famously refused to pitch on *Yom Kippur* - there have been countless Jewish figures, both on the field and behind the scenes, who’ve shaped the game since its earliest days.

In professional sports, there’s often a belief that anything short of a championship is a failure. With such high stakes (and even higher salaries), that mindset makes sense. But many of us fall into the same trap in our own lives. When we set our sights on one particular goal, it’s easy to measure our worth by that single outcome. And when things don’t go as planned, we can feel like we’ve struck out completely.

That’s why I love the spirit of this young ballplayer. Life doesn’t always go the way we expect - but that doesn’t mean we’ve failed. Sometimes it just means we need to look at things from another angle.

In *Pirkei Avot*, a beloved collection of rabbinic teachings, we read: “Who is rich? One who rejoices in what he has.” (*Pirkei Avot* 4:1) It’s easy to focus on what went wrong or what we’re missing. But when we take stock of what we *do* have - our blessings, our opportunities, and even our lessons learned—then every moment can hold a hidden victory.

So I wish you many home runs in the season ahead... and maybe a few errant swings too, if they help open the door to new opportunities, fresh perspectives, and unexpected joy.

HANAH (Huntington Action Network Against Hate) is an interfaith group in Huntington that was formed to combat hate crimes and promote tolerance. The network brings together various religious communities, such as Christians, Jews, and Muslims, to prevent hate and support those affected by it.

My name is Ellie Perlman, a temple member since September 8, 2008, and I have been a member of the Social Action Committee since then. I have stepped up my work with them by recently volunteering to be the Ambassador from our temple. I will be bringing news from monthly HANAH meetings, where information is shared about how everyone in our faith communities can effectively work together to spread love, support and assistance to all in our community.

The following information came from the first two meetings that I attended:

If you are in the position to assist a person who is potentially facing deportation or arrest, Form 4940 is available from the New York State Office of Child and Family Services (ocfs.ny.gov). This form allows a parent to designate another person to make temporary medical and educational decisions for a child and is used for situations where a parent cannot make these decisions for a specific, up to 12-month period. It is a temporary and non-court option for everyday decisions and is different from permanent guardianship or court-ordered custody. Visit the New York State Office of Child and Family Services for Form 4940, which is also available in many different languages.

Here are a few more resources to pass along to anyone in need of assistance:

- **CARECEN** (www.carecenn.org): empowers immigrants through legal services, community education and advocacy.
- **NYIC** (www.nyic.org): The New York Immigration Coalition, a state-wide member-led coalition of immigrant and refugee organizations, works to transform the lives of all New Yorkers by strengthening and building our members' power, organizing and educating our communities and the public, and using our collective voice to advocate for opportunity and justice.
- **Human Rights First** (www.humanrightsfirst.org): Established in 1978, Human Rights First's mission is to ensure that the United States is a global leader on human rights. The organization works in the United States and abroad to promote respect for human rights and the rule of law. Scan the QR code for information on getting a pro bono lawyer from Human Rights First.
